International applicants who are eligible for enrollment in the Graduate School of Environmental Studies with student visa status can apply for "Special application for International students." This brochure is a simple version of the guidelines for such applicants. More detailed information is provided in the Japanese version. Students whose mother tongue is not Japanese are recommended to contact their prospective supervisor to obtain more detailed information.

I. MASTER'S DEGREE PROGRAM

1. Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must meet one of the requirements listed below:

- (1) Graduation, or expected graduation by March 31, 2021 from an undergraduate school or university in Japan.
- (2) Completion, or expected completion by March 31, 2021, of 16 years of formal education in his/her home country or other countries.
- (3) Persons who have been conferred, or expect to be conferred by March 31, 2021, a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree through attending an overseas university or other overseas school (limited to those whose education and research activities have been evaluated by persons who have been certified by the relevant country's government or a related institution, or have been separately designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology as being equivalent to such) and graduated from a program that requires 3 or more years to complete (Includes graduating from a program implemented by the relevant overseas school while living in Japan through distance learning, as well as graduating from a program implemented by an educational facility established with the relevant overseas country's school education system and has received the designation mentioned above).
- (4) Approved by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan (MEXT) (1953 Ministry Bulletin, Vol. 5).
- (5) Persons who have been conferred, or expect to be conferred by March 31, 2021, a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree through attending an overseas university or other overseas school (limited to those whose education and research activities have been evaluated by persons who have been certified by the relevant country's government or a related institution, or have been separately designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology as being equivalent to such) and graduated from a program that requires 3 or more years to complete (Includes graduating from a program implemented by the relevant overseas school while living in Japan through distance learning, as well as graduating from a program implemented by an educational facility established with the relevant overseas country's school

education system and has received the designation mentioned above).

- (6) Have completed 3 years (or above) of education at a university in Japan, or have completed 15 years of formal education at an institution overseas; Or, have completed 15 years of formal education at an overseas institution in Japan (provided the program is equivalent to the formal education in its foreign country and is being recognized by the Japanese Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology) by March 31, 2021.
 - The applicant should also have earned all credits in good academic standing. All mentioned above should be recognized by Graduate School of Environmental Studies.
- (7) Completion of a program of study recognized by the Graduate School of Environmental Studies as equivalent to graduation from a Japanese university.

Note: Applicants wishing to apply based on the requirement (6) or (7) above will be given an eligibility examination. Please contact the Office of Student Affairs at the Graduate School of Environmental Studies for details. A separate application is required for the eligibility examination, to be submitted by December 14, 2020.

2. Departments Offering Master's Degree Programs

Departments offering a Master's Program at the Graduate School of Environmental Studies are as follows:

 - ◆ Architecture Course in the Department of Environmental Engineering and Architecture accept application for Master's Degree program only in July.

3. Application Procedures

Applicants must prepare the following documents and submit them by registered mail, together with the application fee of JPY (Japanese yen) 30,000, (This fee is not required for applicants receiving a Japanese Government(MEXT) Scholarship), to: The Office of Student Affairs, Graduate School of Environmental Studies, Nagoya University, Furo-cho D2–2(510), Chikusa-ku, Nagoya 464-8601, Japan. The application fee must be paid by the Japanese Postal Money Order. Please leave the money order blank when you submit it. Only for overseas applicants are allowed to make payment by credit card, Union pay, and Alipay. Contact us at env@adm.nagoya-u.ac.jp to get further information.

The application must reach the Office of Student Affairs between January 5 and 4:00 p.m. January 8, 2021.

All application documents shall be filled out either in Japanese or English.

 - Note: For applicants who have graduated from a university in the People's Republic of China: We reserve the right to investigate applicants' credentials, for example the Degree Certificate or Expected Graduation Certificate, or the academic transcript submitted by an applicant through the China Academic Degrees and Graduate Education Development Center (CDGDC).

- (10) Graduation thesis or research plan (required only for applicants applying to the Department of Social and Human Environment).
- (11) TOEFL/TOEIC/IELTS original score sheet (Required only for applicants for self-recommendation to the Department of Social and Human Environment)
 Applicants for self-recommendation admission to the Department of Social and Human Environment must submit an original score sheet of the "Examinee Score Report" of TOEFL,

the "Official Score Certificate" of TOEIC, or the "Test Report Form" of IELTS for the English test. Only TOEFL (IBT), TOEIC (Listening & Reading test), and IELTS (Academic Module) are acceptable. Only scores of the examinations taken on or after February 1, 2019, will be acceptable.

However, graduates and soon-to-be graduates from an institution of higher education whose language of instruction is English do not need to submit a TOEFL/TOEIC/IELTS original score sheet.

- (12) Research Proposal (required only for applicants applying to the Department of Social and Human Environment) The research proposal should include the following: 1) background of the problem and objectives of the research, 2) a review of the existing literature, and 3) methodology and methods of the research. The proposal should refer to the relevant literature where appropriate. It shall be written in either Japanese or English. (printing on A4 size)
- (13) Self-Recommendation Letter (Required only for applicants for self-recommendation admission to the Department of Social and Human Environment)
 Applicants for self-recommendation admission to the Department of Social and Human
 Environment must write a self-recommendation letter. (Form 13: A4 size single-sided printing)
- (14) A photocopy of your residence card
 Those applicants who are currently residing in Japan must submit a photocopy of their residence card (both sides).
- (15) Additional Application Form required only for applicants to the Division of Hydrospheric-Atmospheric Science, Department of Earth and Environmental Sciences (Download and fill out the prescribed form from the Graduate School website (Single-sided printing on A4 size))
- (16) Applicants receiving a scholarship from the Japanese Government (MEXT) must provide a Certificate of Status issued by the university where they are currently enrolled. However, the applicant who is presently enrolled in Nagoya University does not need to do it.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED at the time of examination:

For application to the Department of Earth and Environmental Sciences (Division of Hydrospheric-Atmospheric Science), the examinees are required to submit the original score sheet of the "Examinee Score Report" of TOEFL, the "Official Score Certificate" of TOEIC, or the "Test Report Form" of IELTS for the English test. Only TOEFL (IBT), TOEIC (Listening & Reading test), and IELTS

(Academic Module) are acceptable. Only scores of the examinations taken on or after February 1, 2016, will be acceptable for the Department of Earth and Environmental Sciences (Division of Hydrospheric-Atmospheric Science).

For those who still don't have the score sheet, a chance to take the Special English Examination will be given for the applicants to the Department of Earth and Environmental Sciences (Division of Hydrospheric-Atmospheric Science). Please tick appropriate boxes on the Additional Application Form to take the Special English Examination.

No score for the exam subject "English" will be given in the case that the examinee does not submit the score sheet at the specified time.

Note 1: The score sheet will not be returned to the examinee.

Note 2: The school may request the furnishing of further information when necessary.

4. Examination Method

(1) Department of Earth and Environmental Sciences

The Department of Earth and Environmental Sciences consists of the Division of Earth and Planetary Sciences and the Division of Hydrospheric-Atmospheric Sciences. The Division of Earth and Planetary Sciences consists of the following seven laboratories: Earth Environmental Systems, Geology and Geobiology, Geochemistry and Cosmochemistry, Earth and Planetary Physics, Ecology, Earth and Planetary Dynamics, and Chronology and Natural History. The Division of Hydrospheric-Atmospheric Sciences consists of the following four laboratories: Global Environmental Variation, Climate Science, Global Geochemistry, and Global Water Cycle.

The examinees are required to contact their prospective supervisor(s) prior to application, so that the supervisor(s) can prepare for the examination, taking the applicants' language ability and academic background into consideration.

Regarding the "English Test", please refer to the "DOCUMENTS REQUIRED at the time of examination" on page 5.

The examination will be carried out through an online oral examination (about 30 minutes) using a Web conferencing system. Applicants should prepare a quiet environment where the online oral examination can be conducted.

- *1. The detailed information about time and method of the examination will be sent to applicants by January 25 using contact information (e-mail) provided in the submitted application.
- *2. Oral Examination will be conducted online using ZOOM program. The applicants are required to prepare PC, camera, microphone, and to assure stable internet connection during the examination.
- *3. During the Oral Examination (Specialization subject), the applicants must choose two problems to answer from among the following categories: (1) Environmental Engineering and Policy (two problems), (2) Environmental Chemistry (one problem), (3) Systems Science (one problem), (4) Structural Engineering (one problem), and (5) Infrastructure Planning (one problem). Two problems must be chosen from two different categories except (1) Environmental Engineering and Policy, from which both problems can be chosen. The time of the Oral Examination (Specialization subject) is about 15 min.
- *4. Questions in the Oral Examination will be mainly related to knowledge of the specialization field. The time of the Oral Examination (Specialization field) is about 25 min.
- *5. English reading and conversation ability of applicants will be evaluated. The time of the Oral Examination (English) is about 5 min.

- (4) Completion of a program of study recognized by the Graduate School of Environmental Studies as equivalent to the completion of a Master's Degree program from a Japanese university.

Note: Applicants wishing to apply based on the requirement (3) or (4) above will be given an eligibility examination. Please contact the Office of Student Affairs at the Graduate School of Environmental Studies for details. A separate application is required for the eligibility examination, to be submitted by December 14, 2020.

- 1) Applicants who are enrolled in the Master's Course of the Division of Hydrospheric-Atmospheric Sciences at Nagoya University will be asked to give a 10 minute presentation on their Doctoral program research plan. This will be followed by an interview based on the presentation.
- 2) Other applicants will be asked to give a 30 minute presentation on their Master's program research (in 20 minutes) and their Doctoral program research plan (in 10 minutes). This will be followed by an interview based on the presentation.
- 3) Examinees should arrive 10 minutes prior to the start of the examination and wait until called.
- 4) A whiteboard and a PC projector can be used for the presentation. Microsoft Power Point (2016, Japanese version) installed on a Windows PC is available.
- 5) For applicants who cannot reach Nagoya for the examination, the examination will be carried out through an online oral examination using a Web conferencing system instead. Please tick appropriate boxes on the Additional Application Form to request the online oral examination.
